PELLIZZA DA VOLPEDO

Giuseppe Pellizza da Volpedo (28 July, 1868 – 14 June, 1907) was an Italian neo-impressionist painter. He was born and died in Volpedo, in the Piedmont region of northern Italy.

Pellizza was a pupil of Pio Sanquirico. He used a divisionist technique in which a painting is created by the application of paint in small dots and brush strokes.

His most famous work, II Quarto Stato ("The Fourth Estate") (1901), has become a well-known symbol for progressive and socialist causes in Italy, and throughout Europe. The painting is shown during the opening credits of Bernardo Bertolucci's film 1900 and is currently housed at the Museo del Novecento in Milan. An earlier version is held in the Pinacoteca di Brera. The Pellizza Association is a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving Pellizza's heritage and territory.
